## FROM OUR PRINCIPAL, JENNY LAIDLAW

As a community you have truly brought our Values alive and made them meaningful for our tamariki. Our Proprietors need to be honoured and thanked for working so hard to ensure that this upgrade could actually happen!

Term Three has been full steam ahead! Our wonderful students have had a number of exciting learning opportunities. The Life Education bus visited NCA in Weeks 2 & 3 and our Intermediates had a fantastic day up Rainbow ski field. The concept of skiing challenged many of our Yr 7/8 students however by displaying super high levels of determination, perseverance, resilience and flexibility, combined with their ability to work collaboratively together, our fantastic young folk mastered the act of skiing by the end of the day!

Thank you so much to all of the parent volunteers who accompanied this trip - it was a wonderful way to connect with each other and an amazing opportunity to enhance our students self confidence throughout the day and this day really helped to prepare them for college next year.

Our Year 5/6's managed to squeeze an excursion into the Suter Gallery before the rain arrived. The floods really put a dampener on the term and once again we had to retreat into hybrid learning. A number of our families had to be evacuated or were unable to leave their homes. Once again our NCA community shone brightly as we reached out to one another. Your generosity really helped to limit unnecessary trauma for these families.

With the cancellation of our Teacher Only Day we were able to provide a number of students with the opportunity to attend the Inspire Festival which was held at Garin College. We sent a group of 23 students from Yr 4-8 to represent NCA. This group of wonderful young people made us proud as they lived the Values and they shone out brightly with their 'Can Do Attitudes' as they attempted a number of STEAM activities which certainly challenged them. Once again a massive thank you to all of the parents who were able to help out at such short notice. Without you this event would not have been possible.

Our Whole School Speech competition was fantastic! The quality of the speeches and the delivery of the presentations just continues to flourish, even during this very chaotic season. Senior and Intermediate students were selected to represent our school in the Interschool Speech Competition. Daniel M, Maisey S, Lily B and Joshua J were amazing ambassadors for God as they embraced the challenges of public speaking. With massive smiles on their faces, they drew on their faith, shared their speeches and certainly made their teachers, whānau and NCA proud!


